To walk, I aid me with two English sticks, slightly suitable for tumults. But what seemed impossible it was not because, I don't know how, Don José María realized and it was he who pushed through the crowd and extended his hand to me. That detail of affection left a mark on me, as well as the times I've seen him relent to tears when he spoke about our Mother and about his hopes for meeting with Her.

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## The Venerable José María García Lahiguera

### "The humble robs the heart of God"



I would say there is no love in life if there is no humility. It is the essence of love going out from oneself, in surrendering and donation to the beloved. Humility is the necessary virtue to love as one loves when really loves: selflessly.

The humble, as he never attributes any good to himself, but always owns entirely to the Lord, robs the heart of God. For the Lord says, «I can trust him, because, even when he make miracles, I know nothing will happen, everything is going to slip on him, because he knows he owes everything to me.» And God lavishes on him, because «the Lord resists the proud and gives grace to the humble.»



Humility is lovely. It has to rob the heart of God. Oh, the Virgin! In the Incarnation she doesn't speak about her virginity, her chastity... No. She only speaks of *«the lowliness of his servant.»* And that is precisely what has pleased the Lord; and that's the reason for *«He has done great things«* in her. Humility is required to love. It is necessary, indeed. For love always takes an attitude of service, of surrendering, and that doesn't match with self-love. All this, never losing sight of the Incarnation mystery contemplation, where God the Son –Christhas completely forgotten himself, dispensing with everything and everyone and what people will say... Let them say whatever they want. For Him only the Father, the Father's will and glory, matters. Nothing else.
