Biographical notice

José María García Lahiguera was born in Fitero (Navarra-Spain) March 9, 1903, and was baptized three days later. During his lifetime, he always wanted to follow the action of the Holy Spirit in him. When he was still young, he expressed his desire to be a priest, and at Madrid Seminar he left a durable memory of his great virtue. Ordained on May 29, 1926, he was soon called to be spiritual director of the seminarians. Full of zeal for priestly holiness, he founded in 1938 with Mother Ma del Carmen Hidalgo de Caviedes the Oblate Sisters of Christ Priest, a Congregation of contemplative life, which attained Pontifical approval in 1967. D. Jose Maria was appointed Auxiliary Bishop of Madrid in 1950; Bishop of Huelva in 1964; and Archbishop of Valencia in 1969. Promoter of the Feast of Christ the Eternal High Priest, he was happy to see this celebration introduced in the liturgical calendar of Spain in 1973. He died in Madrid, on July 14, 1989, with fame of holiness. His body rests in the Motherhouse chapel of the Oblate Sisters of Christ Priest. Pope Benedict XVI declared him «Venerable» on June 27, 2011.

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On the life and holiness fame of Venerable José María García Lahiguera, Archbishop **Testimonies**

Don José Maria was an exemplary priest, a blessed man, an educator of many generations of priests, regarded as a saint by everyone during his lifetime and after his departure to the Father's house. He lived 86 years deeply marked by divine grace. So he is remembered in Madrid, Huelva and Valencia for his passion for the priesthood and the consecrated life, as a great master of the spiritual life, which has marked several generations among us, and to whom the spiritual renewal of the Spanish diocesan clergy owes so much.



Don José Maria aimed for holiness in all things, but he also lived with frequent struggles, feeling the need for conversion, surmounted by the immense graces received in baptism, in his priestly and episcopal consecration, in daily prayer or Eucharist; and -of course!- in the difficulties in his role of guidance pastor, who is a father, but who must also encourage, correct, direct, cheer and also be rejected. During his long illness he was filled with love for the Virgin and Our Lord in the Holy Sacrament of the altar. "Jesus -he said-, my brother, my friend, my alter ego." "I want to die of God". What did he mean? Something to the affect of not being able to love more, desiring to break our human limits to fully enjoy communion with Him, belonging entirely to Him.

We pray God for his cause may advance with alacrity, so that the whole Church may venerate him as a saint and benefit from his intercession and example; and so that we may further perceive the gaze of the Good Shepherd that reveals the tenderness and compassion of God.

Please excuse my bad writing. I have been sick for over seven months now and this is the first time that I am hand writing a letter since February when I became ill. The other letters were typewritten.




